








Principal News

It's hard to believe that the 2020 school year is rapidly coming to an end. It has certainly been a year full of many challenges, surprises, twists and turns as we have navigated through the Covid 19 pandemic.

To all of our parents and carers, I would like to say thank you for your cooperation in working with myself and our school staff this year, respecting Covid 19 restrictions put in place and for adhering to social distancing protocols where possible. Your support has been greatly appreciated and has gone a long way towards reducing the anxiety levels of staff in these unprecedented times.

When I reflect back on the year I have fond memories of the following experiences our children have been involved in outside of their day-to day learning; excursions, incursions, sports carnivals, masses, liturgies, STEM Open Day, St Joseph's Feast Day, Tri-skills Activity Day, Book Week, Shrove Tuesday Pancake Day, Graduation, assemblies and fund raisers, just to name a few.

As we find ourselves in the Advent season, a time for preparation and waiting, there is an opportunity, regardless of our age, to step back and to evaluate the priorities which we live out in our daily choices. There is a chance to take stock and feel the gentle 'nudging' of the Spirit. So, as Christmas approaches, amidst the busyness of shopping and organisation, perhaps there will be an opportunity to be attentive to the inner voice, the voice which calls us to see at this time of the year the new born child, a countercultural message to reorder our priorities, to put people, not things first and to give first call to love.

Catholic Identity

In the Catholic Church, the season of <u>Advent is a period of preparation</u>, extending over four Sundays, before <u>Christmas</u>. The word *Advent* comes from the Latin word *advenio*, which means "to come to," and refers to the coming of Jesus. This refers, first of all, to our celebration of Jesus' birth at Christmas; but second, to the coming of Jesus in our lives through grace and the <u>Sacrament of Holy Communion</u>; and finally, to His second coming at the end of time. At St Joseph's School we have the opportunity to invite Jesus into our lives through our interactions with others, the relationships we build and through our school celebrations and community building events.

Following Advent we enter the season of Christmas, the shortest of all church seasons. Christmas is the season of great joy. It is a time of God showing His great love for us. It can be a time of healing and renewed strength. Christmas is when we celebrate the birth of the Christ child. God sent His Son, Jesus, into the world to be born. His birth brought great joy to the world. Shepherds, wise men, and angels all shared in the excitement of knowing about this great event. They knew this was no ordinary baby. The prophets had told of His coming hundreds of years before.

As Catholics we believe we are made in the image of God. This makes each of us unique and special just the way we are. The festive season provides an opportunity to pause, reflect and value how important those closest to us are in our lives. Spending quality time together at Christmas is what it is all about.

- Talk to your child about the different situations you find yourself in whereby you are required to read texts.

Farewell to our Two Longest Serving Teachers

It is with an element of sadness that I announce to the school community that our Two Longest Serving Teachers, Malama Theodosi and Fran Wanders will be retiring at the end of this current school year.

Malama has been a teacher within Catholic Education for the past 39 years, 31 of which have been within the St Joseph's School community (1982-1983 and 1992-2020) in a variety of teaching roles including EAL Teacher, Year 5/6 classroom teacher, Year 7 classroom teacher and Reception/Year One classroom teacher. During her time here at St Joseph's, Malama has also held a number of Positions of Responsibility including that of The Arts, Sustainability, Inclusive Education, EAL and Mathematics coordinator.

Fran has been a part of the St Joseph's School community for the past 35 years as an Early Years Educator having taught in the Preschool and as a Reception and Year One classroom teacher. In 2000 Fran also taught Specialist Science R-7 one day per week in addition to her Junior Primary classroom teaching role.

Together Malama and Fran have formed our strong Junior Primary Teaching Team over the past 12 years, working tirelessly in partnership to ensure our children receive the absolute best early years of schooling possible. Their outstanding service and commitment to St Joseph's School is a reflection of their character and the passion they have towards the education of young people.

On behalf of the St Joseph's School community, I would like to extend our congratulations and gratitude to Malama and Fran. The passion, dedication and talents of these wonderful educators have enriched the staff, students and families at St Joseph's. We wish them and their family every blessing as they begin new chapters in their life journey.

In other staffing news, Catherine Crosbie has extended her parental leave until July 2021. Maddie Marenda will continue in her current role of Preschool Coordinator throughout Terms 1 and 2, 2021.

Jennifer Aquino and Danielle Librandi have won the positions of R/1 classroom teachers for 2021 while James McCarthy has won the position of Specialist Physical Education teacher for 2021. Jennifer is well known to the school community having worked in the past as a 2/3 classroom teacher and this year as our New Arrivals teacher. Danielle is also know to the school, returning to us from Woodville Gardens Primary School after having worked here at St Joseph's in 2018 as our Specialist Italian teacher.

James is a graduate teacher who has specialised in Physical Education teaching as part of his degree.

School Nature Play and Sustainability Garden Update

I am pleased to announce that LCS Landscapes has won the contract to develop our Nature Play & Sustainability Garden space. LCS Landscapes is a local company, who along with three other local companies were given the opportunity to bid for the project. In consultation with our architect and Catholic Education South Australia we decided on LCS Landscapes to undertake the project. We remain hopeful that the project will commence before the end of this year with a completion date towards the end of Term 1, 2021.

Fees to reduce across all Catholic Diocesan Primary Schools in 2021

In Term 3 the South Australian Commission for Catholic Schools announced that it will make Catholic Education more affordable by lowering the school fees of every Catholic diocesan primary school in 2021 under its Making Catholic Education More Affordable initiative.

The exact level of fee reduction in each diocesan primary school will vary from school to school to take into account their circumstances and the needs of their families.

Our school has been working with Catholic Education South Australia to finalise our fees for 2021 which are outlined below.

Catholic School Parents SA

The South Australian Commission for Catholic Schools (SACCS) is pleased to announce the formation of Catholic School Parents SA as the new representative body of Catholic school parents.

Catholic School Parents SA will connect with parent groups across the 101 Catholic Schools in the State.

Chair of SACCS, Professor Denis Ralph, said "Parents and carers have always played a pivotal role in the success of Catholic schools in South Australia. This new parent representative and advocacy body will further enhance parent engagement and participation in the education and care of children and young people in

Catholic schools in South Australia."

In 2020, the Commission engaged an independent reviewer to consult with parents in all Catholic schools to seek their feedback as to whether they felt they had an adequate voice in the education of their children and what kind of support they would like to see in the future.

"While acknowledging that the current structures have served parents and our school communities well in the past, the review recognised that parents and carers have busy lives and are looking for new ways to engage in and support the education of their children," Professor Ralph said.

Catholic School Parents SA will be closely aligned with Catholic School Parents Australia, the national body that represents and advocates for parents and carers of children and young people in Catholic schools across Australia, and will seek to have broad representation of parents of students in our schools.

The new group will:

Engage in a program of listening to the needs of parents across Catholic schools

Advocate for improved funding and support for children and young people in Catholic schools and preschools

Ensure parent voice in policy development

Represent parents on a range of committees and working parties

Participate in the work of Catholic School Parents Australia.

"We are excited by the opportunity to engage with parents in our schools in new ways in 2021 and beyond," Professor Ralph said.

Schools will receive further information early in 2021.

Positive Education

In 2006, Dr Martin Seligman first introduced Positive Psychology to Geelong Grammar School in Victoria. Since then, there has been a rapid diffusion of Seligman's educational philosophies and principles in Australian schools. Known today as Positive Education, the results of this partnership are helping educators to transform the way they approach pastoral care in a learning environment and prepare students for lifelong learning and flourishing beyond the school gates. In 2016 I attended a 4 day Discovering Positive Education Conference run by staff from Geelong Grammar School here in Adelaide. In this newsletter I would like to share with you a little of what I learnt about growth mindset.

Professor Carol Dweck from Stanford University suggests that people can be categorised into two groups, those predominantly with a fixed mindset and those predominantly with a growth mindset. Fixed mindset people believe their talents and abilities are set in stone, trying to prove themselves over and over, trying to look smart and talented at all costs. Growth mindset people know that talents can be developed and that great abilities are built over time, believing their qualities can be cultivated through their efforts. Here at St Joseph's School we teach children that through persistence, resilience, practise, displaying confidence, being organised and embracing positive feedback, we strive for excellence, becoming the best we can be in the process, which is very much a growth mindset.
