Reception to Year 3

Mandy from Venus has a friend from Jupiter. Her friend has 3 eyes, 7 arms, 5 legs, 21 fingers and lots of spots. What does he or she look like? What is its name? Try to create number sentences about Mandy's friend.

Years 4-7

Clara has a puzzle to solve. Help her list all numbers that fit these clues: I have two digits. I am less than 96. I am more than 18. The sum of my digits is not even. My ones digit is one more than my tens digit. Please show working out. Example: 34. (Working Out: 3+4=7. 34= 3 Tens and 4 Ones).

Reading is also a core learning area here at St Joseph's School. Children develop their reading skills, knowledge and understanding by reading regularly. At St Joseph's School regular reading at home forms a major part of homework set each evening. Catholic Identity: The Church Season of Lent

During Lent, our school has been participating in Project Compassion which is Caritas Australia's annual Lenten fundraising and awareness-raising appeal bringing thousands of Australians together in solidarity with the world's poor to help end poverty, promote justice and uphold dignity.

This year the theme for Project Compassion is Hope.

Classes have been sharing stories that reflect this year's theme. These inspiring stories tell how the lives of people around the world have changed through Australian Catholic schools like ours and their support of Caritas Australia's development programs.

This Lenten season, on Tuesday 19 March, as part of St Joseph's Day celebrations, we had a Casual Clothes Day to raise money for Project Compassion. Our Casual Clothes Day raised almost \$200.

Inserted into this week's newsletter is a copy of the Archdiocese of Adelaide Commitment Statement: Safeguarding our Children and Young People. The commitment statement reminds us that all children are unique, precious gifts created in the image of God. As parents we have had the opportunity to experience this deep sense of awe at the birth of our children, true gifts from God. Let us not forget how sacred each and every child is as we are called to deeply respect, value and care for all children.

Sports Day: Friday 5 April

Just a reminder that tomorrow is Sports Day. This year Sports Day will be held at Semaphore Beach. It promises to be a great day full of fun for all our children. Below is a recap of details of the day sent home to all families in recent weeks.

Students will be required to be dropped off and picked up from Semaphore Beach. Staff will be available to supervise at the venue from 8.30 am with the day officially beginning at 9:30am. Staff will be waiting at the entrance of the playground in front of Semaphore Jetty to mark off students as they arrive. Pick up will be available from 2.30 pm with presentations due to take place between 2.30 pm and 2.45 pm. Students who are booked into OHSC will be transported to and from the beach by the school provided the necessary permission forms have been completed.

In order to encourage team spirit, enjoyment and participation, all students are encouraged to wear a plain t-shirt in their House Colour. Large logos or slogans are not permitted on these t-shirts. Children are to also wear their school sports shorts/skort/pants, white socks, sneakers and their school hat. Please ensure your child has applied sunscreen prior to arrival. Sunscreen will be available for re-application throughout the day.



NAPLAN Testing

This year our Year 3 and Year 5 children will complete their NAPLAN testing online for the first time although the Year 3 Writing Test will continue to be a paper test. NAPLAN Online Testing will take place on Tuesday May 14 (Writing Test), Wednesday May 15 (Reading Test, Conventions of Language Test), Thursday May 16 (Numeracy Test) and Friday May 17 (Test Catch Up Day). Our school has been preparing to undertake NAPLAN Testing online since July 2018. In October 2018 our current Year 3 and 5 children were involved in a short online practice test to ensure children became familiar with the online format and to make sure our school infrastructure was able to cope with the online testing. This process was repeated again last week. So far preparations have been going to plan.



Student Representative Council

This year our school Student Representative Council (SRC) will take a lead role in driving our whole school Environmental Awareness and Sustainability focus. Already this year the SRC have discussed ways to ensure our planter boxes located around the school remain healthy during the warmer parts of the year. The school has applied for a grant through the Natural Resources Adelaide and Mount Lofty Ranges School Environment Grants program and the SRC has endorsed the idea of using the grant funds to implement the Bring Back the Butterflies initiative whereby part of our front of school kerb/verge and an area of school grounds are landscaped and planted with plants that sustain the local environment by flowering and attracting butterflies, being easy to care for and creating an aesthetically pleasing area to look at and engage in.

Term 3 Reception Intake

St. Joseph's School will have a Reception intake at the start of Term 3 this year. Our Term 3 new Receptions will join our current R/1 classes. Places are limited, therefore if you would like your child to start Reception in Term 3 please make a time to have an enrolment interview with me. Alternatively you may know other families interested in enrolling their child/ren at our school.

Just a reminder that the criteria for starting Reception on the first day of school in Term 3 is that a child will have turned 5 between May 1 and October 31 in that year.

The criteria for starting Reception on the first day of school in Term 1 continues to be that a child will have turned 5 on or before April 30 in that year.

Children whose birthday falls between November 1 and December 31 are not eligible to commence school before the following year.

Volunteer Induction and RAN Training Requirements

Earlier this term our school conducted a Volunteer Induction Workshop for those new to the school and those who have not completed the training in the past.

The workshop equips our school volunteers with the necessary background knowledge of the school and workplace safety protocols to ensure the safety of volunteers, children and staff while engaging in volunteer activities and in the event of an emergency. The workshop also included Responding to Abuse and Neglect (RAN) Training. We are very keen to ensure all our volunteers receive this valuable training.

Parents, caregivers and family members who have volunteered their time within the school and who have not completed the training are asked to make an appointment with our APRIM (Assistant Principal Religious Identity and Mission) Simon McCullough to arrange a suitable time to complete the training.
